
Bold Leadership...Biblical Principles for Marketplace Impact



Personal Renewal

I have a confession to make...and maybe you can relate to it. I have a tendency to get overly busy. For example, since mid-2007, I returned to school and completed a doctoral program in leadership, developed a leadership program for a network of more than 800 churches in Cambodia and trained two dozen men and women to teach the program, developed and taught a strategic thinking and strategic planning course in Ecuador, completed management and coaching certifications, wrote and published Bold Leadership, and kept up with my leadership training, coaching, and consulting practice, while rarely missing my boys' sporting events. I'm sure you have your own story, which may be crazier than mine.

I knew I needed a break this summer, so we took a three-week vacation. We were a couple days into the vacation when I realized I was in worse shape than I thought. I was exhausted and took naps daily. My body, though exhausted, just kind of buzzed. My wife had been telling me for some time that we needed to find more balance. I knew she was right, but it wasn't until I got off the tread mill for those three weeks that I realized how right she was.

Richard Swenson, M.D., in his book, *Margin*, says, "There can be little doubt that the contemporary absence of margin is linked to the march of progress...Those cultures with the most progress are the same as those with the least margin...Margin has been stolen away, and progress was the thief." Swenson defines margin as, "the space between our load and our limits." Our lack of margin results in a litany of physical, emotional, relational, and spiritual pain.

Though only a few weeks have passed since our vacation ended, my wife and I are committed to slowing things down. We review our family calendar and discuss whether or not we can attend certain events. I have committed to not spending as much time in my office. For example, I left my office a couple of hours early one day and took my boys to a nearby lake to swim, play in the mud (we literally had a mud fight), and just relax. We had a great time! I have resumed my workout program to help shed those extra stress pounds I have accumulated in the past year.

How about you? Do you need to take some time for personal renewal? Has anyone been telling you that you needed to find more balance? I encourage you to take some time to reflect and act!
